Highways and PROW

High Road/single carriage way T junction - much concern on poor visibility due to long grass. Accident waiting to happen, especially with road sign on High Road indicating junction awaiting replacement as no longer there.

Flooding continues to be an issue at this junction due to drain filled with mud. This has been reported on several occasions.

Howlett Way/High Road roundabout - concern reported regarding -

Poor visibility on Sausage shop side due to overgrowth of bushes.

Bushes on roundabout itself reduce visibility of oncoming traffic
