Road signage

Single track carriage - passing places signs have at last been replaced. Certainly will improve safety on dark wet nights, especially motorists unfamiliar with this road.

On last inspection 30th August, I noted Give way sign yet to be corrected at junction of Morston Hall Road/High Road. Also at this junction noted and concern expressed by some residents that T junction sign remains replacing. This is in spite of Carly reporting at least twice and recent accident.

Storm drain at this junction remains blocked due to mud and other debris.

This causes flooding in the area consequently pedestrians needing to walk in middle of road to bypass area.

This has been reported on several occasions but no action taken despite pedestrians safety issues.

30 mile hour signs along High Road barely legible due to extreme fading.

Speeding along High Road, Kirton Road, St Martins Green, Quiet Lanes continues to be of concern to residents

Footpaths - hedge alongside Trimley St Martin school playfield - in several places overgrowth currently requires walking in the road. Footpath opposite this area and onwards to Innocence Lane junction currently overgrown narrowing path significantly.

Footpath from Roselea to school - overgrowth (grass, brambles, nettles) currently not attended to to ensure safe/ ease of passage to school

Felixstowe Peninsula Community Partnership

Living wall project - partnership are researching tp implement a planted wall alongside some school boundaries. The aim is to absorb harmful particulates and gases and reducing air borne pollutants caused by traffic as part on improving air quality. Langer Primary School are working with

FPCP in piloting this project in the first instance.

Public transport - as in Cllr D'arville's report, a situation arose whereby information relating to diversion of buses along High Road was not cascaded down to ensure PC's and local bus depot could inform users of temporary diversion.

Goslings Farm Shop- now all boarded up and products outside removed. No further news received. Speculation, as always in such matters, abounds by various residents
