How to enjoy the Trimley St. Martin countryside

Walks

Footpath Maps. There are many individual Rights of Way in Trimley St. Martin and there are three notice boards outlining their routes. They are located outside the Memorial Hall; Roselea Nursery; the Picnic Site on Capel Hall Lane. Please be aware that many of our footpaths run through working countryside. Sometimes farmers have to disturb the paths in order to prepare the land and plant their crops. Reinstatement should be within two weeks. You will normally be able to follow the usual route of the right of way, but this can be difficult to see if work has recently taken place so it helps if you have a map with you.

Many of the footpaths are included in a series of Eight Walks compiled by two residents. The walks also enumerate places/names of interest. There is also a wheel friendly walk to Kirton. Some of the walks cover parts of the neighbouring villages. They can be downloaded onto your phone or printed out. Nature notes for the area may be found on the same website page. As you undertake the walks, you may be curious about some places, their names and their history. On the same website page, you will find a Gazetteer, which is relevant to the walks but also to those interested in the village.

Currently it does not include the origins of all the road names in the Village. However, the details below may be helpful to you.

New Village Street Names

Allens Drive: At the time of the 1807 Inclosure Act, the majority of the field opposite The Hand in Hand was called The Allens.

Drewry Way: Yvonne Drewry was a renowned artist who lived in the Mill House on Kirton Road.

Goslings Way: Goslings, in Thorpe Lane, was the farmhouse where the Smiths lived. The land on which Gosling Way is situated was owned by the Smiths.

Nassau Drive: George Nassau was the last Lord of the Manor who lived in Grimston Hall sometime in the 1780s. Grimston Hall was the seat of the Lords of Grimston Manor. He introduced the 1807 Inclosure Act.

Nigel Way: Nigel Smith, a local farmer, was the owner of the land on which Nigel Way is situated.

Oak Tree Drive: Oak trees are the trees associated with Trimley and Grimston Hall. Thomas Cavendish, the second circumnavigator of the globe, was born in Grimston hall. After his first successful voyage, an avenue of Quercus llex was planted on the approach to Grimston Hall from High Road (Ilex Quercus is commonly known as the Holm Oak). Rivers Walk: The land on which The Lilacs stands was farmed by Solomon Rivers in 1807. The majority of his land was spread across the two Trimleys. Solomon Rivers was one of the Parish Overseers at the start of the 19th century. Rosemary Way: This brings to mind Rosemary Gitsham, who served the village faithfully as Village Recorder for approximately twenty years. She died in 2021.

Brief key points concerning the history of Trimley St. Martin

Occupation in our village predates the Romans and during the archaeological excavations on the new housing development known as The Lilacs, Bronze age burial urns were discovered.

The earliest written documentation of Trimley is in the Domesday book (1086). Only a small part of the current Trimley Villages were known as Tremlega at the time. The Tenant-in-chief was Roger Bigod, a close ally of William the Conqueror. From about the 13th century onwards, it is possible to trace the Lords of the Manor who included: the Earls of Norfolk; the Brotherton family; the Cavendish Family; the Crown; the Barker family; George Nassau and his brother William, 2nd Earl of Rochester and then the Dukes of Hamilton.

George Tomline, who lived at Orwell Park in Nacton, bought the title of Lord of the Manor from the Duke of Hamilton. He was responsible for the construction of the Ipswich to Felixstowe railway line and the initial development of Felixstowe Docks in the late 19th century. After the death of Mr Ernest George Pretyman in 1931, what is now known as The Trimley Estate was sold to Trinity College Cambridge in 1936. It is managed by Bidwells Estate Agents, who manage the estate from their office in Cordy's Lane, Trimley St. Mary. Trinity College was persuaded to purchase the estate because of its suitability for land development. The last eighty years have seen considerable growth on Trinity land and more is proposed for the 2020s.

The two churches standing side by side, St. Martin and St. Mary, are a distinctive feature of the two villages. At the time of Domesday, the Trimleys were not defined as such but the area we now occupy is easily recognised. Domesday mentions four churches in our area: two in the Trimleys; one at the Alteinestuna (Alston) settlement; one at Strattuna (Stratton). The first recorded incumbent of St. Martin's was Nicholas de Gudmunlegh in 1315. Please note, the two existing Trimley churches, St. Martin and St. Mary were probably not constructed until the late 14th century. Local mythology says they were built by two sisters who fell out. It is impossible to verify or dismiss this romantic story.

Grimston Hall was the home and birthplace of Thomas Cavendish (1560 - 1592), arguably the most famous of Trimley's inhabitants. He was the second person to circumnavigate the world between 1586 - 1588. He died at sea during his second attempt at circumnavigation. He is commemorated on the Village sign.
